Learn what auditors are looking for before you get audited, and how you can make sure your business is in compliance.

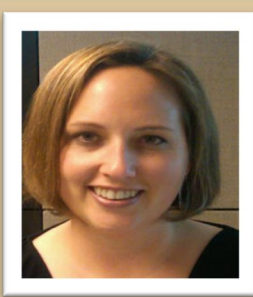
Event Summary

The Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) has very specific requires for how employees are paid. Are you doing what is necessary to pay your employee's accordingly and also makes sure you are in complete compliance with the act?
